COMPETITIONS

Whether it is monetary donations, in person tutoring, leading community initiatives, the focus — and mission — of SVY has always been about giving back to the community. This past year, SVY hosted a series of successful panel events, where we invited SVY leaders share their experience with others. Speakers spoke on topics like college life, time management, school courses, extracurricular activities, and leadership. Through these panel events, we managed to reach and inspire over 700 students across the world, who came to listen to our seminars both in person and virtually.

SEMESTER 1:
